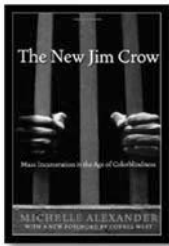

Bishop's Convocation

Approximately ninety people attended the second annual Bishop's Convocation on March 12. Held at St. Michael's in Camillus, the focus of the convocation was the Use of the Means of Grace, setting a base line for our approach to Worship and Word and Sacraments.



Pastor Kevin Strickland, Assistant to the Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton and Executive for Worship for the ELCA, led the group through a visual presentation, conversation, small group discussion and hymn singing to ground those present in a deeper understanding of what it is we do as the church when we gather for worship.

A word of great thanks to all of the people at St. Michael's and Pastor Janet Fechner for hosting us so graciously on such a beautiful spring day. Upstate New York Synod Awarded \$25,000 for Congregational Renewal

In December, 2015 with the guidance of the Synod Council and Bishop Macholz, the Director for Evangelical Mission, Rev. Norma Malfatti, submitted a grant proposal for just over \$21,000 to the Always Being Made New: Campaign for the ELCA to help congregations in Upstate New York engage in a three-fold faith formation adventure centered in stewardship and generosity, mission and evangelism, and nurturing a new ecology of faith formation for the 21st century. The team that reviewed the proposal was so excited for Upstate New York's plans they awarded us \$25,000! Here's what it looks like:



The Generosity Project is a ½ day interactive and intergenerational workshop modeling a congregation's potential to connect and equip people of all ages as stewards of God's love and abundance. The Stewardship Table will be available to lead congregations through this beginning in the Fall.

Transformational Ministry is a 12-18 month process with 4 workshops led by the Regional Renewal Tables for congregation leaders to gain tools for spiritual renewal, evangelism, and mission to take back home and help their congregation grow in mission and ministry. This is not a boiler plate program that can be applied the same way in all places. Instead it is a process focused on connecting with God, connecting with each other, and connecting with the world – the three sections the Congregational Vitality Assessment that many have taken in our synod. The Regional Renewal Tables will be ready to host workshops this Summer.

Finally, six congregations in our synod will take part in Vibrant Faith University, a two-year online curriculum that helps leaders develop the knowledge, skills, and practices of faith formation that engages all ages intergenerationally; nurtures family faith and equips parents to talk about God and faith at home; utilizes and develops digitally-enabled strategies for faith formation; and much more. The six leaders will help form a new Faith Formation Table, share their experience with VFU and be a support team for congregations and their Faith Formation/Christian Education teams.

Our Synod Council took the following actions over the winter months—

- ◇ *Approved contracting with Benefit Resources to administer the synod's health reimbursements;*
- ◇ *Endorsed Bishop's signature on South Wedge Mission's covenant with the Episcopal Diocese of Rochester once it is finalized;*
- ◇ *Approved application of the Upstate New York Synod for recognized status as the responsible entity for Lutheran Disaster Response on our territory;*
- ◇ *Approved adoption of Synod's Employee Handbook; and*
- ◇ *Mission Support increased by \$8,000 this year. Synod Council expresses their heart-felt thanks.*
