My virtual office door is always open for roster care, whether it's a question from a rostered leader about On Leave from Call, retirement, or a question about a situation in a congregation. Hopefully, I can either answer the question or get them to the right person. I work with the Bishop's schedule, travel the Synod as necessary, and work with our Mobility Specialist, Rachel Sosebee, on congregational transitions in our Synod. You can catch me on Monday morning for our Synod 9@9, and sometimes leading worship at a Synod event. Please know that I am here to listen and respond (if that is what's needed.) Justice Ministries

- Racial Justice Rev. Kwame Pitts and Tom Craig, have co-lead this ministry and put together events and educational opportunities for the UNY synod.
- Gender Justice Rev. Tonya Eza has been a faithful leader of this
 ministry that has stretched across our conferences; they have
 recently stepped down, and Rev. Andrew Tobias Nelson, has begun
 as lead communicator for this ministry.
- Creation Justice is on pause
- Hunger Justice due to the change in the process of grants from World Hunger-ELCA only one of our congregations from the UNYS was awarded a grant this year. The funding sources will change in 2024.



Stewardship/ Mission

- Training completed with the Lake Institute on new trends on fundraising and mission which lead me to work with two congregations to develop their stewardship campaign for 2023-2024 year.
- Worked with 3 congregations to develop their stewardship / Mission emphasis

- Oasis Buffalo NY Rev. Kwame Pitts for persons that are for the spiritually curious and looking for safe spaces to explore their faith.
- Journey of Faith (New) Vestal NY Todd Eames birthed out of redevelopment process of Christ the King and currently worshipping in "house church" model.
- South Asian (New) Buffalo NY Rev. Sohail Ahktar exploration of the possibility of working with the Pakistani community
- SWM Rochester NY Rev. Matthew Nicoloff in the process of organizing for 2024 to become a "full" congregation
- Hope Troy NY Rev. Pamela Hoh in the process of organizing for 2024 and has been designated as a LEAD congregation for innovative work and exploration.

Rachel Sosebee, Mobility Specialist Mobility Annual Report- 2023

My 10 hours a week are spent in a variety of ways, but reading Roster Minister Profiles and coaching and resourcing call committees, Ministry Site Profile writing teams, congregational councils, conference deans and candidates in the discernment and call process is the majority of my time.

In 2023 we had 7 successful call votes. There are currently 9 congregations with active MSP's in the churchwide system and a couple more are moving towards preparing and submitting their MSPs.

This year I also contributed to two projects that are alongside mobility. I worked with a team of pastors and lay leaders to begin updating our Transition resources. Round one was updating the documents (covenants, checklists, guides, and sample documents) from our 2003 resource. These documents are being edited by the Bishop's team and then will be shared with leaders for use. We will work on the next round of resources starting in late Spring 2024.

The other opportunity I had the honor of participating in was to work with Bishop Miller and 4 congregations in South Erie County to discuss a possible collaboration. This work is on-going, but has given us a possible framework to use for other areas interested in exploring collaborative ministry.

I love my job! My greatest joy is getting to walk with congregational leaders and rostered leaders as they discern. I am privileged to meet many passionate people living out their call in a variety of ways and to hear their stories and see God moving. God is good!
