## 50 years ago...

On November 22, 1970, Elizabeth Platz became the first woman ordained in the LCA and in all the Lutheran denominations in America.

## 40 years ago...

In the LCA, the first women of color ordained within their individual racial groups were Lydia Rivera Kalb and Earlean Miller (1979), and Asha George-Guiser (1982); in the ALC, they were Kwang Ja Yu (1985), Maria-Alma Copeland and Marlene Whiterabbit Helgemo (1987).

## 10 years ago...

Ruth Frost and Phyllis Zillhart, a lesbian couple, were the first to be extraordinarily ordained; twenty years later, in 2010, they were added to the ELCA rooster in a "Rite of Reception" that included Anita Hill.
